The event, fuelled by a passion for promoting female participation in sports, with 40 female sports ambassadors who took on the roles of team managers, efficiently orchestrating the activities across five vibrant pitches at Stanley Park Sports ground.

The festival was a celebration of #letgirlsplay encouraging girls to embrace the joy of playing football. The infectious enthusiasm on display made it clear that the day was more than just a sporting event, it was a platform for fostering teamwork, camaraderie, and making new friend..

With the pitches buzzing with energy, each team (named after the Lionesses) showcased their skills, creating an electric atmosphere. The Barclays Girls Football Festival emphasised the importance of breaking barriers and encouraging young girls to embrace the sport with confidence.

Overall, the festival was a testament to the power of inclusivity and the transformative impact of providing young girls with opportunities to engage in sports. It was a day filled with laughter, teamwork, and the sheer joy of playing the beautiful game, leaving a lasting impression on all participants and reinforcing the belief that every girl deserves the chance to shine on the football field.

The main part of the session was about fitness testing and pupils tried out fitness tests in flexibility, strength, endurance, balance, power, speed, co-ordination and agility. At the end they identified their strengths and areas for development thinking about ways in which they could improve their fitness. Well done to this years cohort who proved themselves to be incredibly motivated and keen to get involved.

The Talent Team group have another follow up session later in the year when they join the Chippenham Sports Partnership on a trip to the Arc to try out their climbing skills! We are looking forward to seeing this enthusiastic group of pupils again then!

To quote another pupil from Redland we had the "doublest best day!"


































Year 3 and 4 Multi Skills
